Stony Garden Road Closed

Stony Garden Road is closed between Roundhouse Road and Reed Lane due to a bridge replacement. During the closure, drivers will be directed to use Deerwood Lane, Route 563 (Mountain View Drive), and Route 412 (Durham Lane). Work is expected to be completed by Monday, June 1st.

Cyber Security Corner

The Haycock Township IT Committee would like residents to be aware of the following cyber security concerns:

Email Spoofing

Attackers may send emails pretending to be someone you know or an authority figure.

Defense: Ensure that the emails you are receiving are from an authentic email address before responding or clicking on any links.

Text Scam Alert

The E-ZPass text scam is an active "smishing" (SMS phishing) campaign where scammers send fraudulent text messages claiming you owe money for unpaid tolls. Do not click and do not reply. Delete it and report it to your mobile carrier.

The messages are designed to steal your personal and financial information. E-ZPass and other toll agencies do not send unsolicited texts for payment. If you are concerned you might have an unpaid toll, check your account by navigating to the official E-ZPass website or using the official mobile app.
